IF <2 years of a single foreign language in high school—must complete 1105-1106 or equivalent in college (these 6 hours do not count toward the 120 required for graduation)

(AREA 4) Scientific Reasoning & Discovery (6 hours)
(NOTE: Must complete 2 non-duplicating courses in a single science; labs not required for major) (AREA 5) Quantitative & Symbolic Reasoning (6 hours)
(AREA 6) Creativity and Aesthetic Experience (3 hours)
(NOTE: One three-credit course required; three one-credit courses will not meet this requirement)
(AREA 7) Critical Issues in a Global Context (3 hours) (NOTE: With the exception of courses used to satisfy History Core Degree Requirements, area may be met with approved History courses)

In accordance with university guidelines, courses satisfying degree requirements may not be double counted to satisfy other areas of a degree (e.g. CLE, Pathways).
