Required - 3 credits (meets 3 credits in Reasoning in the Social Sciences / Ethical Reasoning) MGT 2354: Leadership for Managers and Entrepreneurs (PRE: Sophomore standing) (3) Elective courses – Select at least 9 credits from list on page 2 (6 credits must be Pathways*) Minor electives should be chosen as complements to your major to develop skills in 1) Creativity and Innovation; 2) Critical and Strategic Thinking; 3) Intercultural Communication; and/or 4) Holistic Thinking and Ethical Reasoning. To count as a Pathways Minor, students must take courses in at least three Pathways Core Outcome areas, and both Integrative Outcomes. The introductory course is Social Sciences and Ethical Reasoning. For electives, please choose two courses from two additional Core Outcome areas and the Intercultural and Global Awareness outcome. Required Experiential Activity – 3 credits The experiential activity may take the form of a campus activity, community activity, or an internship that offers significant leadership experience that is consistent with the goals of the minor. In certain cases, other courses that are directly related to a leadership activity can be substituted for the experiential activity. Admission decisions will be made as applications are received. Applicants should receive a response, in writing, within two weeks of the decision. An advising meeting with the BLC Director is required before the minor becomes official.

Students must complete the minor with at least a 2.0 in the 18 semester hours required by the minor.

Course substitution requests must be proposed in writing via the course substitution survey found on the Business Leadership Center's website (http://www.buslead.pamplin.vt.edu/course-substitution/). Course substitutions must meet the Pathways Core and Integrative Outcomes requirements as described by Pathways General Education (https://www.pathways.prov.vt.edu/).
