



International Business Minor For students entering under UG Catalog 2023-2024

The International Business (IB) minor is open to all university students with a GPA of at least 2.0. However, all non-Pamplin students must complete a Pamplin international experience in order to earn the IB minor.

To complete the International Business minor, students must pass the 18 credits of required and elective classes listed below with an average of a 2.0 in these courses. Additionally, students must satisfy the foreign language and international experience requirements listed on page two. No course grade may be lower than a C- to earn the minor. The minor will be noted on the student's transcript.

IV. FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

- a. Passed at least four years of a single foreign language in high school.
- b. Passed three years of a single foreign language in high school, plus two years of a different foreign language in high school.
- c. *Passed three years of a single foreign language in high school, plus two semesters of a university-level foreign language sequence (may be used in Part III above), e.g. SPAN 1105-1106 or 1114
- d. Completion of a 2106 foreign language course may take up to four semesters of a single university-level foreign language (e.g. FR 1105, 1106, 2105, 2106) (may be used in Part III above)
- Foreign language will be waived for international students
- *If you choose a different language than high school, you may take any language at the 1000-level. Otherwise, you must take 2000-level courses.
- < INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENT — If not a study abroad experience, the experience must be verified by the Director of Global Study Abroad. All non-Pamplin students are required to complete a Pamplin study abroad experience in order to earn the minor.
