(1) a C- or better in MATH 1205, 1206, and 1114 or MATH 1225, 1226, and 2114

(2) a B- or better in MATH 1015, 1016 and 2015 or MATH 1014, 1025, and 1026

(3) a B- or better in MATH 1525 and 1526

** The prerequisites for ECON 3204 are ECON 2006 and ECON 3104 and completion of one of the following MATH sequences.

(1) a C- or better in MATH 1205, 1206, and 1114 or MATH 1225, 1226, and 2114

(2) a B- or better in MATH 1015, 1016 and 2015 or MATH 1014, 1025, and 1026

(3) a B- or better in MATH 1525 and 1526

*** ECON 4984 Special Study, ECON 4754 Internship, ECON 4964 Field Study, and ECON 4974 (and 4974H) Independent Study do not count as ECON electives.
