Admission will be competitive and will be based on the following criteria:

- Minimum 2.00 overall GPA;
- Completion of two CLE Area 5 Quantitative and Symbolic Reasoning courses;
- Written statement of interest in the entrepreneurial purpose associated with new venture growth (1 page)
- Submission of this application to the Department of Management (2007 Pamplin Hall);

Decisions will be made within ten to fourteen business days, and the applicant will then be notified by email.
