Satisfactory Progress: By the end of the academic year in which the student has attempted 72 hours (including transfer, advanced placement, advanced standing and credit by examination), "satisfactory progress" will consist of 1) a grade point average of at least 2.0; 2) at least 24 credits that apply to the University Core; and 3) 9 semester credits of departmental or option requirements.

Foreign Language Requirement: A sequence of 2 foreign language courses is required for graduation unless 2 high school units/years of the same foreign language or 6 transfer credit hours of foreign language have been earned. Credits for the required foreign language courses do not count toward the 120-hour minimum requirement for graduation

Students should discuss the requirements for their major with their advisor prior to registering for classes each semester.
