WHEREAS, Virginia Tech has been awarded a Jean Monnet Center of Excellence by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) of the European Commission (EC); and

WHEREAS, Virginia Tech has been awarded a Jean Monnet Chair by the Education, Audiovisual and Culture Executive Agency (EACEA) of the European Commission (EC); and

WHEREAS, Virginia Tech has established close academic ties with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), the NATO Parliamentary Assembly, and the Atlantic Council of the United States; and

WHEREAS, Virginia Tech is in the process of establishing a Center for EUropean Union, Transatlantic, and Trans-European Space Studies (CEUTTSS) – *A Jean Monnet Center of Excellence*; and

WHEREAS, CEUTTSS teaching and learning mission is associated with an undergraduate inter/multidisciplinary academic program in the field of EUropean and Transatlantic Studies; and

WHEREAS, a significant number of faculty members in the Department of Political Science but also in other departments and colleges have international reputations, active research agendas, outreach activities, and teaching responsibilities in the area of EUropean and Transatlantic Studies; and

WHEREAS, a significant number of students already take courses associated with EUropean and Transatlantic Studies demonstrating curriculum strength, post-graduation success, and a growing interest in this field of study; and

WHEREAS, there is a growing demand at the federal level for employees specializing in EUropean and transatlantic affairs; and

WHEREAS, students in the Major in EUropean & Transatlantic Studies will be prepared for pursuing a wide-range of careers in the fields of diplomacy, security, international organization, defense, intelligence, and homeland security; and

WHEREAS, the title EUropean and Transatlantic Studies is recognizable and understandable to high school and college students seeking a program related to security and foreign policy.
