Fall Commencement

Commencement ceremonies will be held on Friday, December 15 in Cassell Coliseum. The timeline of the day was reviewed and can be found in Appendix A. Set-up for the ceremonies will mostly be done on Wednesday, December 13 with final touches on Thursday, December 14. A rehearsal will be held on Thursday, December 14 at 4:00 p.m. This is not a dress rehearsal and students do not attend. The rehearsal is a time for the stage party and those with speaking or volunteer roles to see the space, test the microphone, and ask questions.

The University Ceremony for undergraduate students will take place at 10:30 a.m. and doors will open at 9:30 a.m. A luncheon will be served to stage party between the ceremonies. The Graduate School Ceremony will begin at 2:30 p.m.

Commencement Speakers

The University Commencement Speaker has been chosen through suggestions provided by university leadership. Dr. Amy Pruden was selected and has agreed to speak.

The University Ceremony will have one student speaker this year. This year the speaker will be Erin Highland, the Ring Dance Chair for the Class of 2024.

The Graduate School Ceremony will have three student speakers, following the nut-shell game layout of 90 seconds speeches. Students will be selected in several weeks.

Spring Commencement Schedule

The Spring Commencement schedule of ceremonies is going through university leadership approval. Once approved the final schedule will be shared with the committee again before sharing with the public. The current timeline has public announce on November 13th.

This new schedule will have to be reevaluated each year for viability of campus resources. The current number of requested ceremonies will soon result in a full week of ceremonies, which the university would prefer not to have. While the schedule of college ceremonies may change, the University Ceremony will continue to be Friday morning.

Fall Commencement Marshal

Diane Zahm, Committee Chair, has sent out the call for marshals to Associate Deans and the representatives on the committee. Representatives can be a marshal. Each representative was reminded to check what their college process is for providing volunteer marshals. The list of names is due by December 1st.

For each ceremony (undergraduate and graduate), each college was asked to provide:

- 1- marshal with regalia to lead graduates to the podium
- 1- marshal [with or without regalia] to assist with other aspects of the ceremonies, for example, seating graduates in advance of the ceremony and directing graduates back to their seats during the ceremonies. Regalia is welcomed, but will not be required for this marshal.
- 1 escort *without regalia* to assist with ADA services.

Less volunteer marshals will be necessary for the Graduate School Ceremony. Marshals will receive instructions from the Special Events Office before the event.
