- 3. GPA of 2.5 or above in all history courses by the end of semester in which you have attempted 18 hours of history.
- 4. GPA of 2.0 or above in all history courses by the semester in which you have attempted 96 hours.

#### Foreign Language

(AREA 2) Ideas, Cultural Traditions, and Values (6 hours) (NOTE: With the exception of courses used to satisfy History Core Degree Requirements, area may be met with approved History courses
(AREA 3) Society and Human Behavior (6 hours)
(NOTE: With the exception of courses used to satisfy History Core Degree Requirements, area may be met with approved History courses
(AREA 4) Scientific Reasoning & Discovery (6 hours)
(NOTE: Must complete 2 non-duplicating courses in a single science; labs not required for major)  (AREA 5) Quantitative & Symbolic Reasoning (6 hours)
(AREA 6) Creativity and Aesthetic Experience (3 hours)
(NOTE: One three-credit course required; three one-credit courses will not meet this requirement)
(AREA 7) Critical Issues in a Global Context (3 hours)
