GPA Requirements: Students must maintain a 2.0 GPA in the Classical Studies major. The in-major GPA is calculated as the GPA in all courses a student takes for the Classical Studies Major, including both the common degree core and the major requirements. A minimum grade of C (2.0) must be earned by Classical Studies majors in all courses taken to satisfy the Classical Studies major. No course taken Pass/Fail can be included in a Classical Studies Major.

Total Hours Required: Students must complete a minimum of 120 hours in order to graduate.

Satisfactory Progress Toward Degree, in addition to university policies regarding satisfactory progress:

1. Completion of 15 hours of the major upon having completed 72 hours.
